This paper will investigate the changed policy of the Tanzanian government towards continuous refugee influx after its independence in 1964. It is apparent that perceptions of refugees have also shifted in local, regional and international arenas and due to the confines of this paper, developments on these fronts will only be mentioned peripherally. The refugee situation in the Great Lake Region of Tanzania is of exceptional importance for a selected number of reasons: 1) Tanzania has been host to the highest number of refugees on the African continent therefore putting a uncontested burden on the nation 2) The country acts as case for an increasing awareness of sovereignty, especially in...
